2011 Annual Report Chief's Narrative – The Year in Review

Although not directly affecting the Willowick Police Department, the introduction to this year's annual addresses the issue of line of duty deaths. The cover photo is a picture of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Memorial in North Carolina showing a fallen officer with his comrade reaching out for help. In 2011, 164 Police Officers were killed in the line of duty nationwide. In the sense that every police officer puts their life on the line each day, we are all affected by these deaths which seem to get more frequent and brutal every year. This year's annual report is dedicated to their memories and sacrifice.

Change was the keyword in 2011 from the beginning. In the first 2 months, 3 long term employees retired: Lt. Donald Krockner, Sgt. Robert Boos and Disp. Emily Scigliano. As a result of these 2 officer vacancies and 1 from 2010, 3 new officers were hired: Ptls. Keith Lawrence, Bryan Kravos and Stephen Sobkowich. This put us in bind as all three needed various levels of training before being put in patrol on their own. By November, all 3 were finally fully trained and on the road.

We were hit with 2 officers on extended sick leaves in 2011 which made staffing our number one priority and our number one problem. Both overtime and creative scheduling were required to maintain our minimum staffing of 3 road officers. After almost 32 years of service, Sgt. Ralph Stanek's sick leave resulted in his eventual retirement from the department in late August. While retirements after a long career are generally celebrated, the downside was that due to budgetary concerns, a replacement officer would not be hired. This would place the police department at 23 full time sworn officers, the lowest we had since 1976. Our staffing issues will continue into 2012 as the economy in general is slow to improve. As with many other communities, this may result in attempts to generate additional revenue to offset costs. Otherwise, the alternative could be a further reduction in staffing and ultimately services.

The controversial Senate Bill 5 regarding collective bargaining was the focus of law enforcement at a state-wide level. The media was inundated with arguments for both proponents and opponents of the bill. Without getting into the merits of either side, a historic vote repealed this legislation and collective bargaining was upheld.

Two major equipment upgrades were completed in 2011. The 911 system was updated and now compliant with all requirements. Mapping of calls and a computerization of how the calls are taken and

tracked was the end result. The dispatch surveillance camera system was also updated and expanded to better protect the Safety Center and better monitor the jail and secure areas of the police department.

The truly tragic event of 2011 was the death of William Putzbach in the Willoughby Hills. William was reported as a missing person in Willowick. Due to the diligent and untiring efforts of Detectives John Malady and Robert Prochazka, he was located on Sunday, April 17th, but unfortunately, he was already dead in the trunk of his car. As a result of their work and investigation, 3 men were arrested by Willoughby Hills Police for the victim's robbery and murder. Our sincere condolences are still extended to the family for this tragedy.

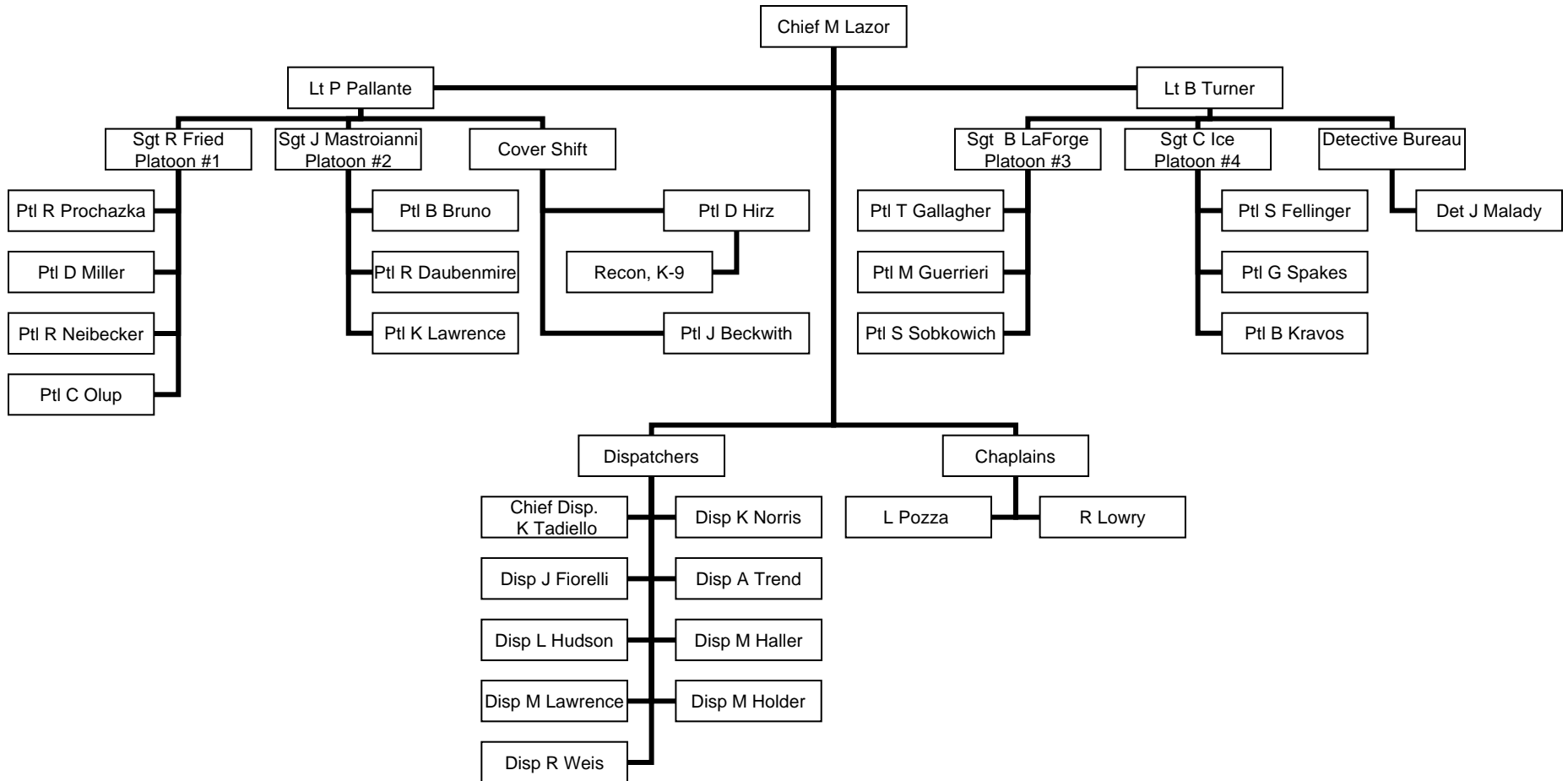
For the year 2012, one goal will be the new county wide radio system which should finally go on-line after 4 years of preparation.

The other goal will be maintaining police services and this will continue to be the primary focus of this department's energies. However, the loss of an officer in 2011 has resulted in putting a detective back into patrol which will curtail the Bureau's investigations. As a result, police operations will be greatly affected by our ability to at least maintain our current staffing.

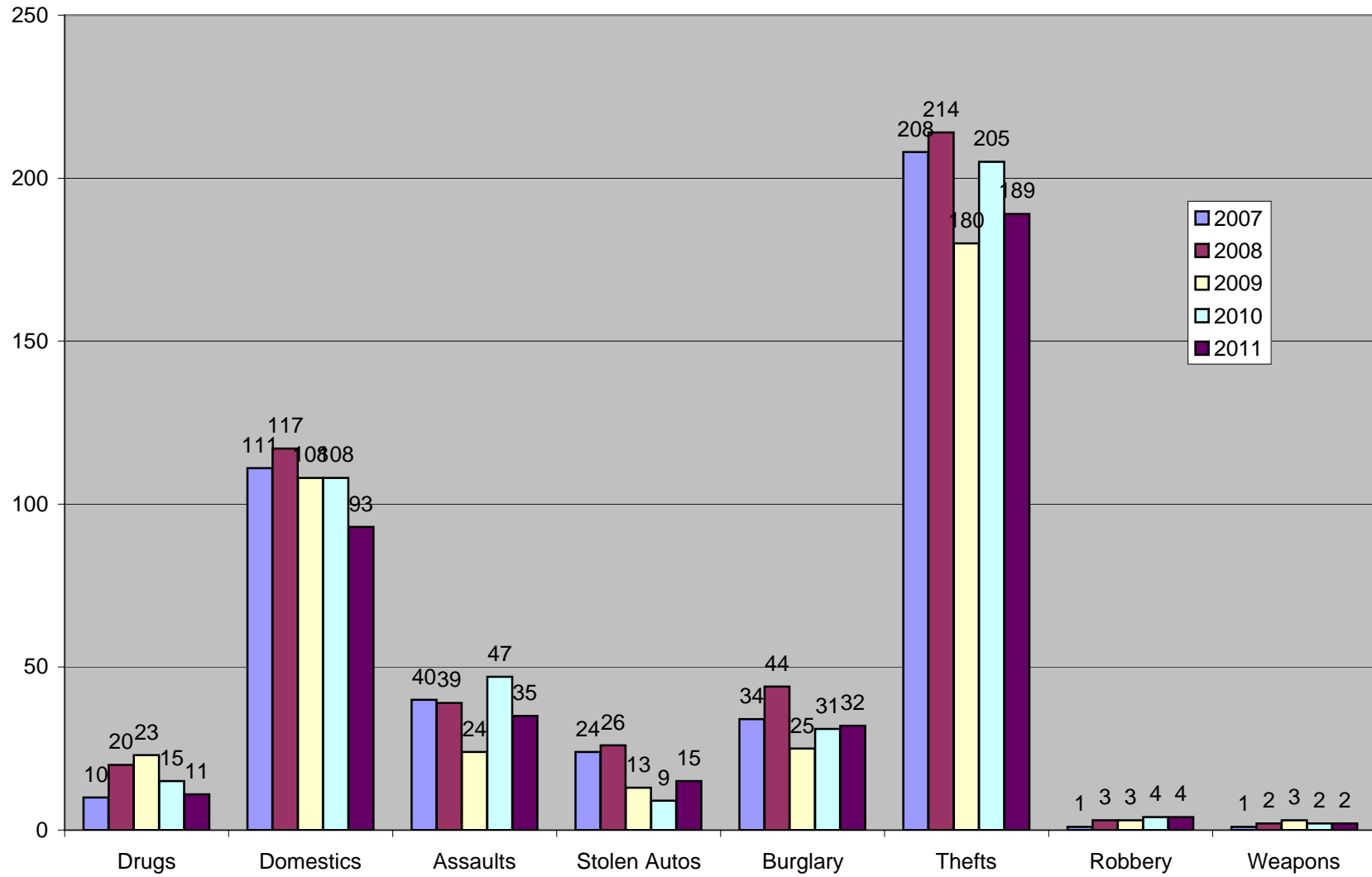

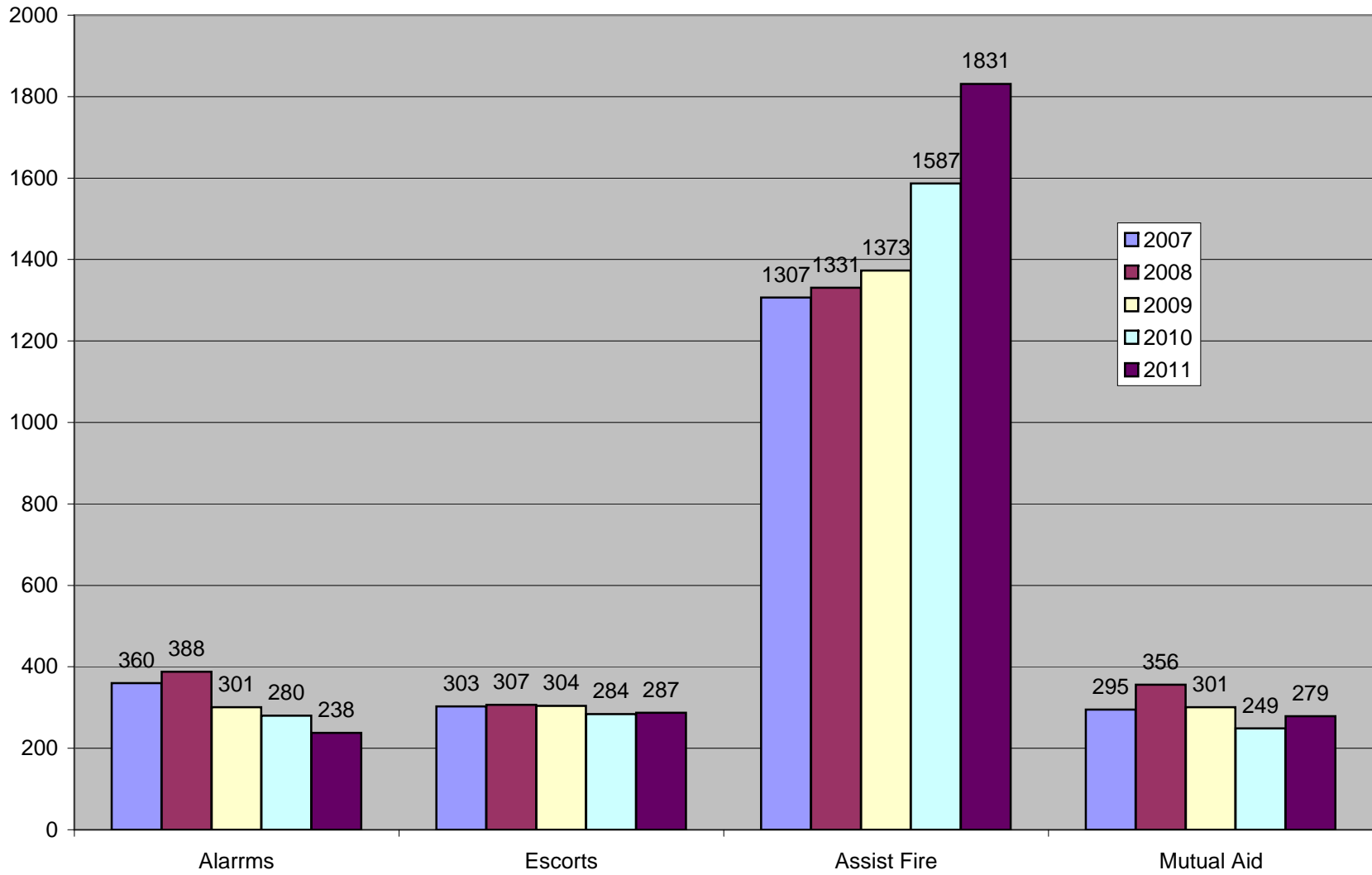

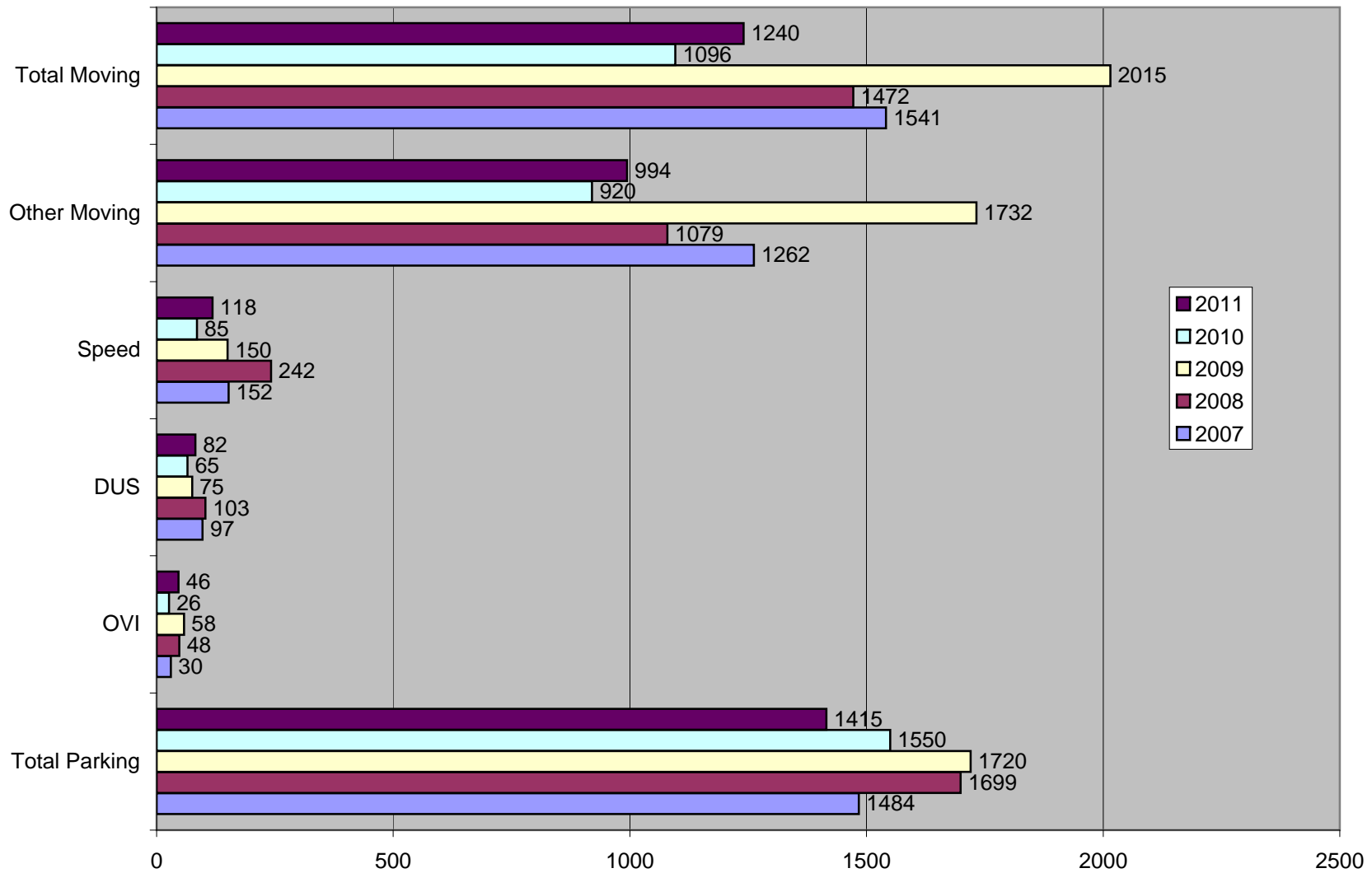

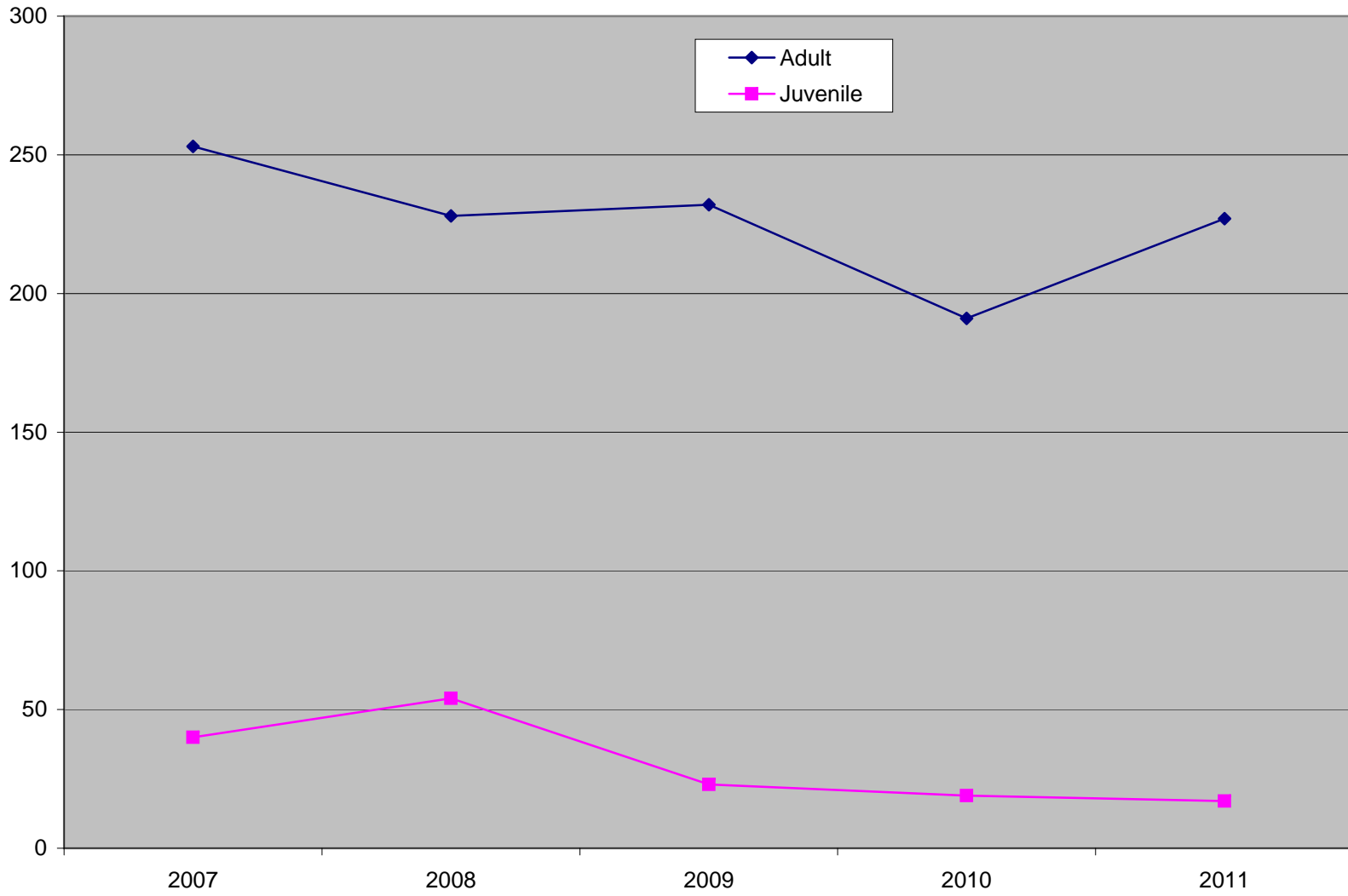

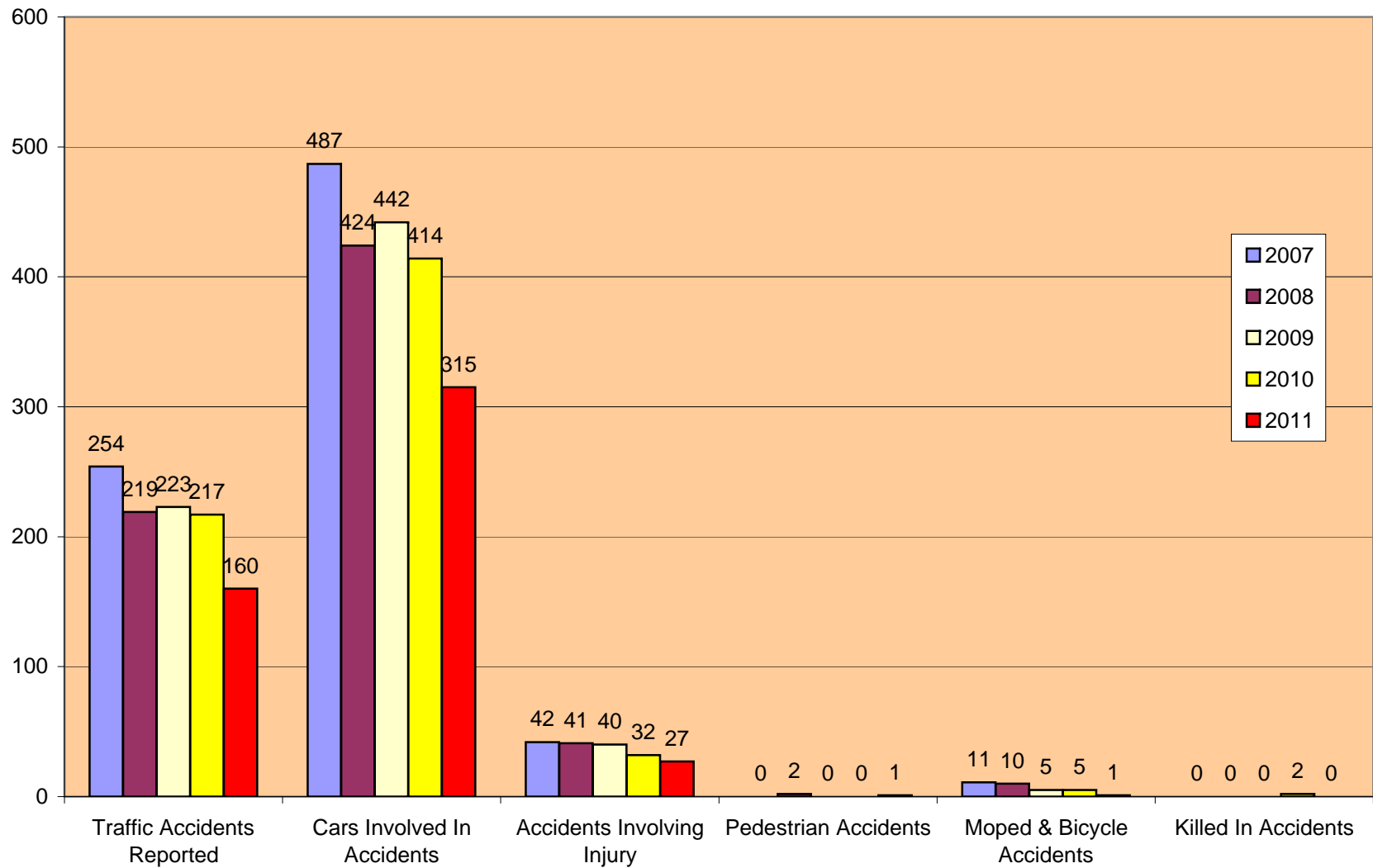

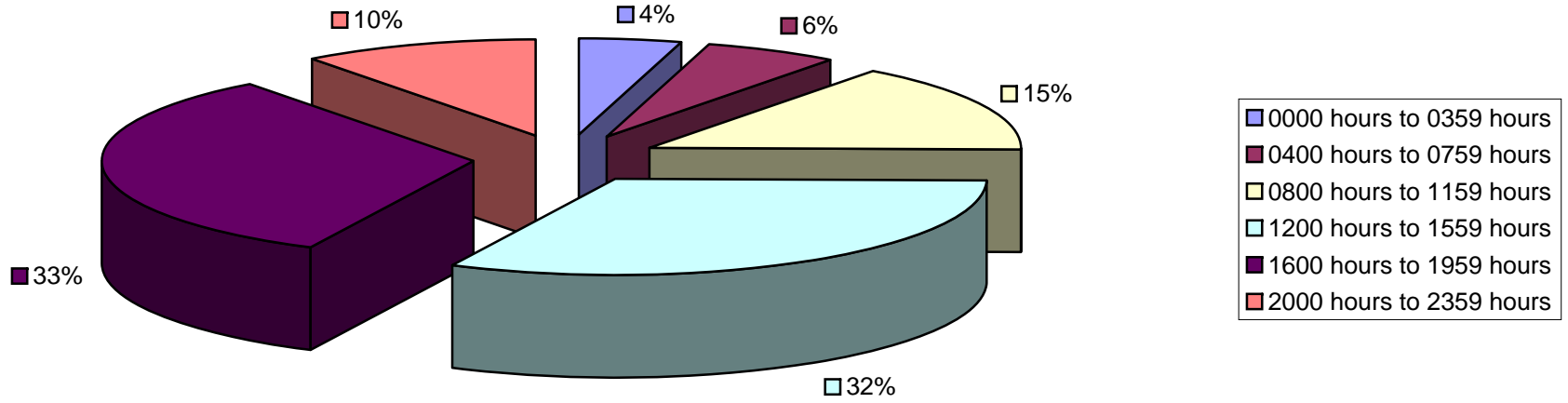

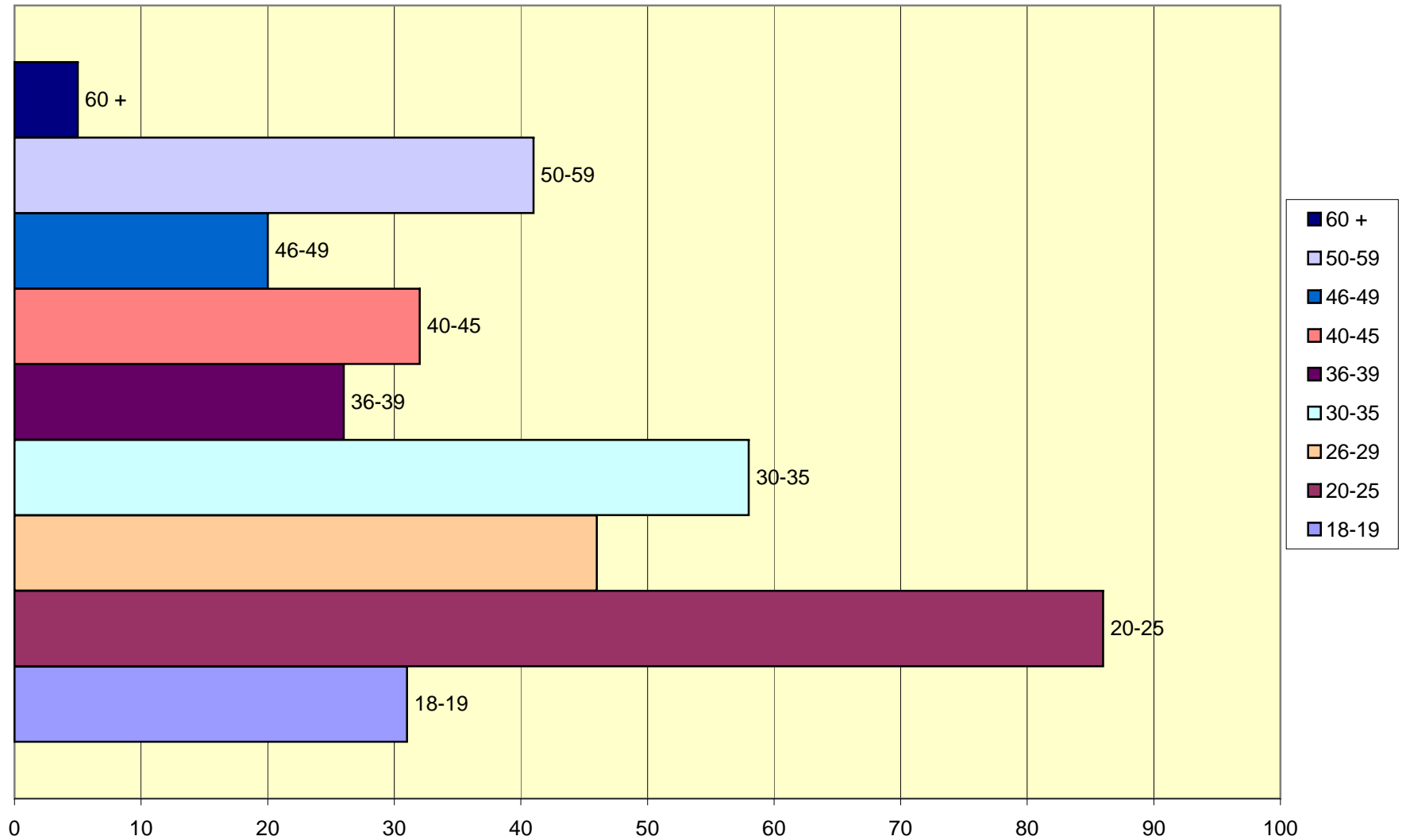

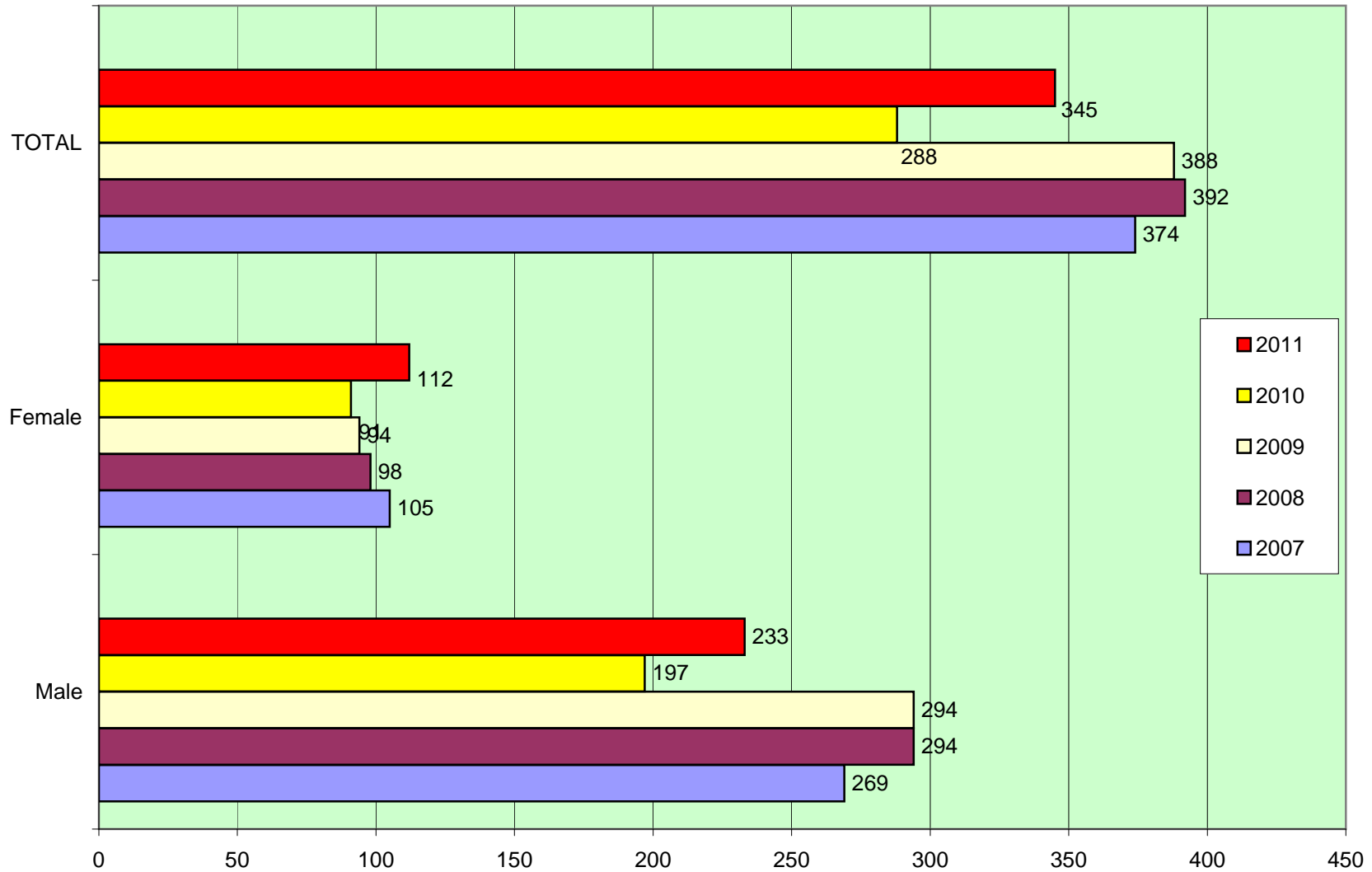

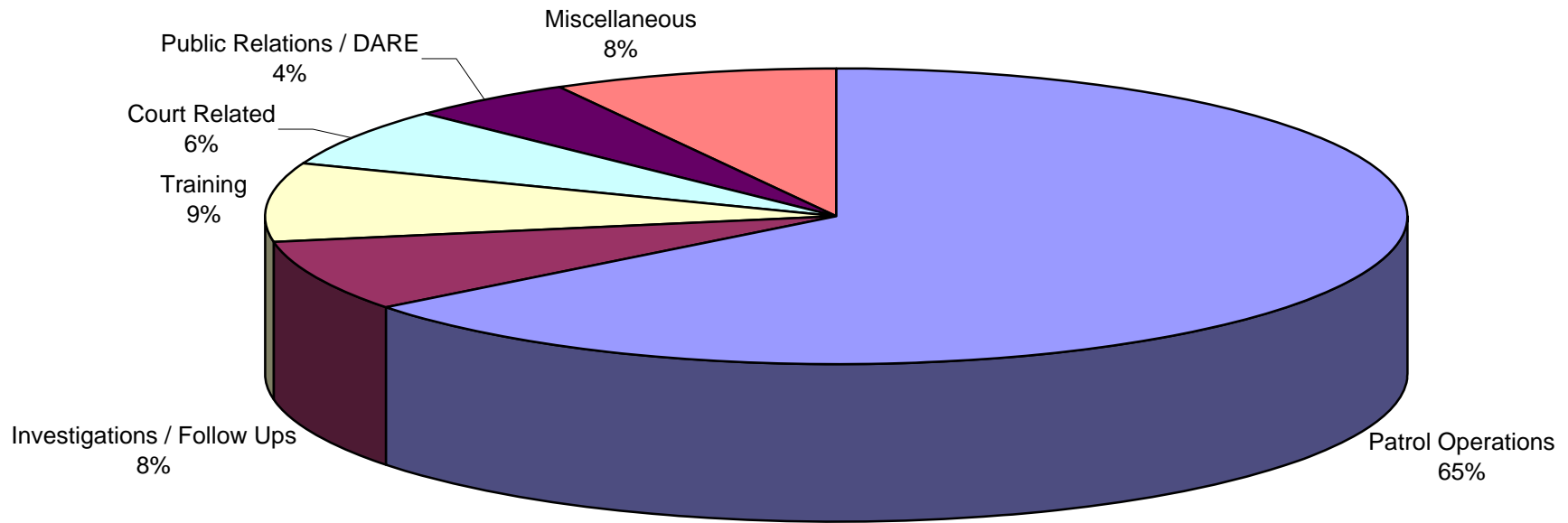

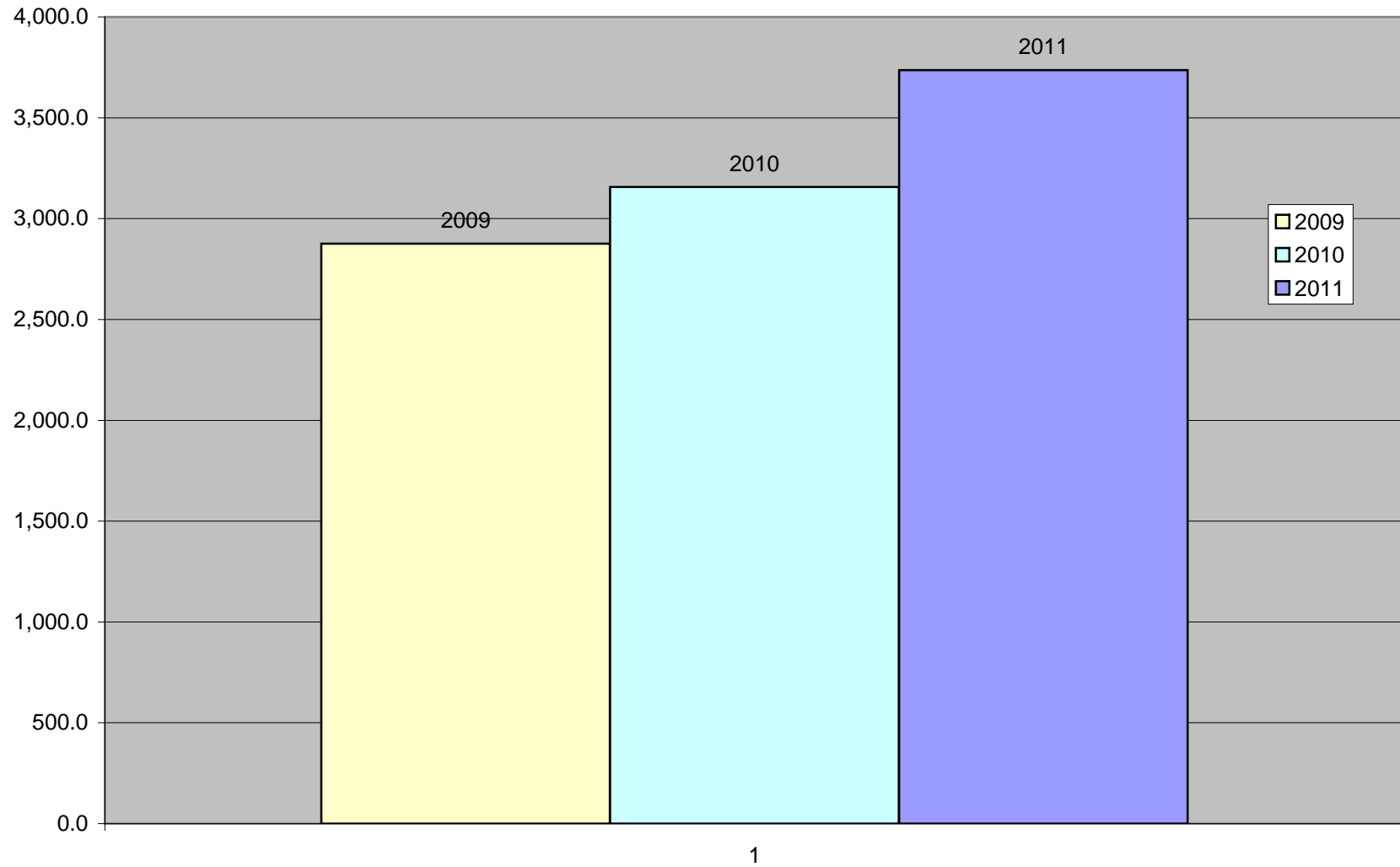

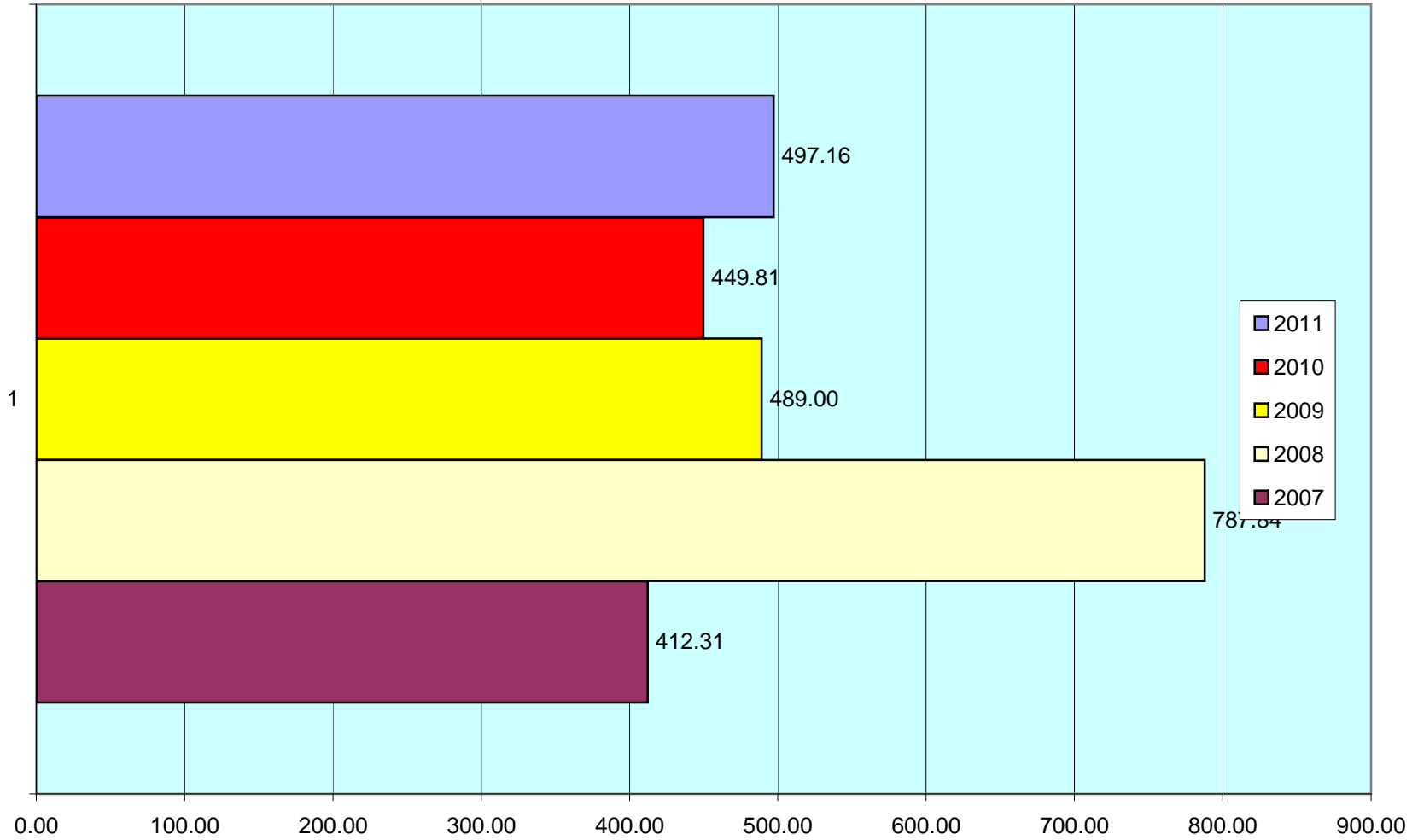

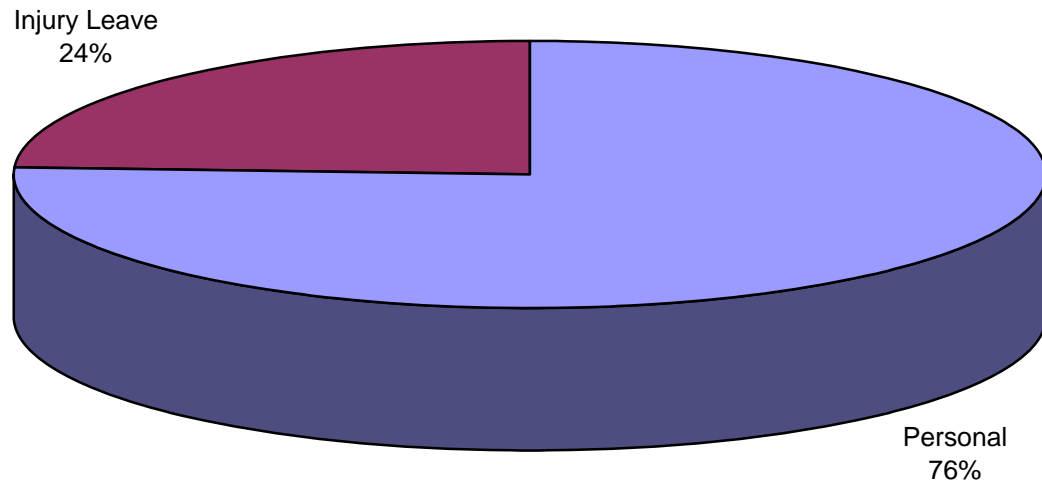
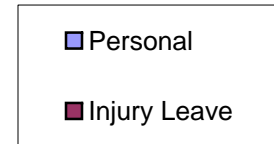
